Reflection – Rev Chris Martin (Stoke Gabriel)

My wife tells me that I am prone to occasional flashes of romance. I have written a poem or two to her,or surprised her with some flowers from time to time. Sometimes, I even give her a kiss without her asking! When it comes to Valentine cards, in our 31 years of marriage, I don't think I've missed a year...but please don't quote me in her hearing!

We don't usually go out for dinner on Valentine's Day but in any case, this year I won't be able to wine and dine my lovely wife because Valentine's Day falls on Ash Wednesday, the start of Lent. So I will be marking her forehead in ash instead!

Seriously though, the coincidence of the dates this year is a really helpful reminder to us that although Lent is a solemn period of self-reflection, a time of honest 'facing up' to those parts of ourselves that we don't often let others see and a time for curbing the many appetites that, when unchecked, can bring self-destruction, Lent is also a period for remembering that we are deeply loved, warts and all. The pre-cursor to Jesus's 40 days in the wilderness was the voice from heaven at his baptism, 'You are my son, my beloved, with whom I am well pleased' and the temptations he faced in the desert were the subtle whispers designed to undermine his confidence and trust in his identity as a beloved child of God.

So, as we face into this season and the wild beasts that roam within each of us, let's do it remembering that we are deeply loved and known, not just for who we are becoming, but for who we already are.



The Great Bake Off Take Off!



We're all set for the **Bake off Take off**, 3-5.pm, Saturday 10th February, in St John's Bridgetown. It's a joint enterprise with St Mary's, and will give publicity to our two church fundraising projects.

Another aim is **fun-raising**. This is an event for all comers, not just the two congregations. We are inviting participants to make either a gingerbread church tower, or a sponge cake with an icing sugar illustration of a sailing boat; or both. Susan (my spouse) and I have been

Birgit, whose German Bakery stall in the market is much loved, will judge the entries.

As well as the cake baking and eating there will be a foodie quiz for teams; also a sing along, with just two songs: one written specially for the occasion, and one from my children's song book (copies will be available for sale at £5,



proceeds to the churches).

Adults pay £3, and all under eighteens come free. This is an event for bakers and for families, and we'd like to fill all 120 available places, so please encourage your friends and neighbours to come - with cakes if possible, but that's not essential. 

Lent Vigil for Climate Justice by Green Christian Vice Chair, Barbara Echlin.

Green Christian is joining with Christian Aid, Tearfund, CAFOD, A Rocha, the Salvation Army, CCA and others in planning a prayerful and powerful climate action in Lent this year.

From Ash Wednesday, for ten days, a 24/7 Lent

Vigil for Climate Justice will take place outside Parliament. The Vigil begins with a reflective Service at St John's Waterloo at 1pm on Wednesday 14 February. An Ashing ceremony will follow the Service outside in the church garden. From there we will make our way to Parliament where the 24/7 Lent Vigil for Climate Justice will begin at 3pm. At the Service we will be lamenting the failure to address the climate and environmental crisis. We will bear witness to the impacts of climate disruption on our global neighbours who have done the least to cause the crisis.

As we approach the resurrection transformation of Easter, in longing for the change we want to see, we will pray for transformation, even in the midst of injustice. Our prayers will be for bold climate action from the UK Government.

Wednesday 14 February is also St Valentine's Day: a day to show our love for this beautiful planet, our common home, which we share with all God's creatures. Around the world creation is crying out. Heatwaves, fires, droughts and floods are becoming more frequent, wrecking lives, land, and livelihoods. Meanwhile, the biggest polluters who have caused this crisis make vast profits from fossil fuels. As creation groans, the poorest, who have done the least to cause the problem, are paying the price. This is unjust. Locating our vigil outside Westminster is a political move. We want to bear witness to past failures to act on and to the impacts of the climate crisis, and pray for the UK Government to take bold climate action. We also want our prayers to move us into action to call on our politicians for climate justice. At the vigil, as we pray, we will call on the UK Government to:

- Make the UK's biggest polluters pay for climate action
- Deliver and build on the UK's international climate finance pledges and pay into the UN's Loss and Damage Fund
- Ban new UK-based fossil fuel projects
